

STINSON BEACH VILLAGE ASSOCIATION MINUTES: February 4, 2017

- I. Meeting was called to order at 10:07 a.m. and proper notice was acknowledged.
Board members present were Mike Matthews, Sam Matthews, Peter Asmus, Lisa Bieringer, Anne Rand and Lee Pollak
- II. Meeting minutes from January 7, 2017 meeting approved by the Board by email. Move to adopt the minutes, passed.
Going forward, meeting minute approval practice will be revised to include a “DRAFT” watermark and will be sent to the membership for review and approval at the next meeting. Meeting minutes will be amended to address any corrections.

- IV. OLD BUSINESS: Painting of the fence at the GGNRA leach field.
Move to use \$1,000 donation to the SBVA to underwrite the cost of painting the fence. Membership voted to pass, unanimously.

Note: Under the By-laws the person elected Vice-President serves 1 year and becomes President the following year. Vice-President, Mike Matthews, will become President following the election.
 2. Nominations from the Floor
 3. Voting: Motion to accept the proposed slate. Membership voted and passed unanimously.
 4. Mike Matthews acknowledged the current President Terry Gordon for his dedication and contributions as President. Membership acknowledged and sent “Thanks” to Terry.
 - B. Adoption of the 2017 Budget (Draft Budget attached)
 1. The Board proposed an allocation of \$3,000.00 to Community Development and proposes that the SBVA form an ad hoc committee to study the possible benefits and associated costs of updating the now 30-year-old Community Plan. If the ad hoc committee finds sufficient benefit in doing so and the membership agrees, these funds would provide the seed money to begin the process.
 2. Mike Matthews provided history on the Community Plan and the Village Association. He stated that the plan is included on the SBVA website www.Stinsonbeachvillage.org

3. Anne Rand moved to approve the budget with the addition of the \$3,000 expenditure for forming an ad hoc committee to review the Community Plan. Membership approved unanimously.
4. Sam Matthews and Lynn Fuller expressed their interest in joining the ad hoc committee.

C. Traffic Enforcement - Marin County Deputy Sheriff Doug Pittman

1. Sherriff Pittman addressed the membership, introducing himself, his role and his involvement with Nextdoor, Twitter and Facebook. He uses Twitter to get urgent information out immediately. Lynn Fuller asked about "Alert Marin" for getting emergency alerts. Sherriff Pittman stated that it has not been effective as of late. The Sherriff's Department is looking for a way to have a single source of information. Sherriff Pittman stated that currently the best source for up-to-date information is through Twitter. The Twitter handle is "MarinSherriff." Nextdoor has also been a good place to check in regarding road closures as residents are posting updates as they encounter conditions. Concern was expressed regarding the closure of Highway 1, potentially through the Fall, and the wear and tear and congestion on Panoramic Highway.
2. Mike Matthews raised the issue of rolling through our stop signs and the impact on safety. Sherriff Pittman addressed the need to enforce full stops at stop signs. Gayle Hanson asked about possibility of a stoplight. Sherriff Pittman offered his opinion on whether or not that would be effective. There was an open discussion of increased traffic during peak visitor times in SB and how to manage the congestion. Mike Matthews asked about what the conduct protocol for officers during a traffic stop. Sherriff Pittman relayed that it is first about officer safety and it's the law that a person being pulled over obeys everything the officer instructs them to do. He explained that officers are now wearing body cameras and it has improved their ability to address issues of "he said/she said." Lynn Fuller inquired about other traffic calming measures. Beth Perry thanked the County for keeping Panoramic open.
3. Sheriff's Department is looking into options for parking sign fines/towing notice revisions to improve the illegal parking issues in the village.

D. Caltrans Upcoming Project on Highway 1- Arnica MacCarthy, DOT

1. Arnica MacCarthy and Stefan Galvez-Abadia introduced themselves and encouraged meeting attendees to share any questions or concerns they have so they can be shared with CalTrans. They gave a presentation on plans for road improvements in and near Stinson Beach. Future improvements will include the creation of rumble strips at 30 miles of the 50 miles of Marin Highway 1 and improvements to pull outs. Ms. MacCarthy also presented the Shoulder Widening Plan for Stinson Beach. The work will take place in the Spring and Summer of 2018. The work will take 2-4 weeks to complete. Traffic will be one-way traffic controlled by flagmen during that time. Kevin New asked if a noise study was conducted for the rumble strips. CalTrans has not conducted one, but stated that the rumble strips will not be located

near residences. See attached for presentation. The membership thanked CalTrans for their service and for the plan.
