Our maintenance crew would like to offer a **monthly drop-in work day**: is 2nd Thurs morning a good time? proposed work includes sweeping, trimming veg, painting and adopting the planter box.

The **Kent Island** project holds volunteer work days from 10-2 pm the first Friday and third Saturday of every month starting April 21st through October.

Traffic calming suggestions invited! signage? camera showing weather conditions promoted more widely? The good news: We will have contracted parking attendants this summer: Memorial Day Weekend, every weekend from mid-June to mid-August and Labor Day weekend.

The latest information on the **Bolinas North End Project** is that the Board of Supervisors accepted the Conceptual Design Report and authorized MCOSD to proceed with the development of the Bolinas Wye Project, which is shown as Phase 1 in the report. This entails developing construction design documents, beginning environmental review, and pursuing funding to implement the project. We have secured a Coastal Conservancy Grant for \$250,000 that will go towards developing construction documents. We hope to secure a consultant to prepare the designs by the end of the summer.

Check out these accomplishments from seasons 1-5 and join this year's program to continue the progress!

- 16 nonnative plant and tree species removed from the island;
- 20 acres of restored habitat;
- 10x increase in the number of rare Pink Sand Verbena and Point Reyes Bird's Beak plants;
- 10-20ft of erosion along the south eastern side of the island
- 1,000's of volunteer work hours!
